

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-23

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK
MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY CHANGING
THE NAME OF LOCUST AVENUE TO JUSTICE O'HERN WAY**

WHEREAS, Justice O'Hern was a lifelong resident of the Borough of Red Bank who was born and raised on Locust Avenue and was a beloved member of our community and dedicated public servant; and

WHEREAS, Justice O'Hern began his law practice here before his entry into local government and served as Mayor of the Borough of Red Bank from January 1, 1969 until his resignation on May 12, 1978; and

WHEREAS, Justice O'Hern rose to the lofty position of State Supreme Court Justice and upon his retirement from that position returned to his humble roots at his Red Bank law firm;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Red Bank as follows:

SECTION ONE: That the street presently known as Locust Avenue, running from Shrewsbury Avenue westerly to the Navesink River shall remain so named and be granted a ceremonial name to be known as Justice O'Hern Way.

SECTION TWO: The Borough Administrator shall cause appropriate action, including the erection of signs, to implement this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall be effective on August 10, 2009.
