AN ACT to incorporate the borough of Red Bank in the county of Monmouth.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1 1. The inhabitants of that portion of the county of Monmouth hereinafter set
2 forth, are hereby constituted and declared to be a body corporate in fact and in law
3 by the name of "The Borough of Red Bank," and as such shall be governed by the
4 general laws of this State relating to boroughs.

1 2. The boundaries of said borough shall be as follows:

2 Beginning at a monument planted at ordinary high water mark on the south
3 shore of the North Shrewsbury river, in the county of Monmouth, which monu-
4 ment is distant one mile easterly in a straight line from the northwest corner of
5 Maple avenue, where it ends at the original shore of the river, near Allen's dock.
6 Said beginning point being north forty-seven degrees and forty minutes east three
7 hundred and twenty-five feet from a marble monument, marking the northwest cor-
8 ner of the division line of lands of Francis White and lands formerly the Boyd es-
9 tate. Said beginning point being also south thirty-six degrees and forty-five min-
10 utes west one hundred and forty-one and six-tenths feet from a marble monument
11 marking the northeast corner of the Boyd estate and Tyson's land. Running thence
12 southerly, westerly and northerly on a curved line, describing a part of a true circle,
13 the radius of which is one mile, and the pivot or center point thereof is the said north-

14 west corner of Maple avenue; said curved line being now marked by monuments at
15 East Front street, Prospect avenue, Tower Hill avenue, Spring street and Branch
16 avenue, also crossing the center line of the New York and Long Branch railroad in
17 the center of Broad street, also crossing Shrewsbury avenue at a monument standing
18 on the west side thereof at a point two hundred and sixty-three feet northerly from
19 the north side of the Newman Springs road; thence continuing northwesterly still
20 on said curved line, until it intersects the boundary line between Shrewsbury and
21 Middletown townships in the middle of said river at or near the range of the center
22 line of Beach street continued westward; thence northerly and easterly down said
23 river, following the boundary line between said townships to a point where the
24 tangent of said curve from the beginning point, produced northerly, intersects said
25 boundary line; thence from said intersection southerly on said tangent to the place
26 of beginning.

1. 3. This act shall take effect immediately.


