19:34-6 OBSTRUCTING OR INTERFERING WITH POLLING PLACE OR VOTERS If a person shall on election day tamper, deface or interfere with any polling booth or obstruct the entrance to any polling place, or electioneering within any polling place within one hundred (100) feet thereof, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

COMMENTS FROM COUNCIL

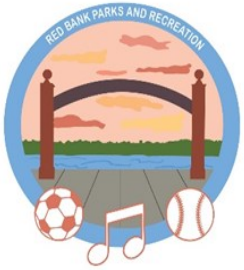
