


Brush Pick-up has two remaining collections on each side of town for this year.

West of Broad Street collection is on the second Thursday of the month. September 14 & October 12

East of Broad Street collection is on the third Thursday of the month. September 21 & October 19

Please remember that tree limbs and branches should be placed loose at the curb line, with no piece exceeding four feet in length. **No other debris or solid waste shall be mixed in with the brush.**

Parents are urged to educate their children on looking both ways before crossing roadways, crossing only at corners, playing away from traffic, watch for turning cars and obeying crossing guards and police officers.

Parents should "pre-walk" their children to and from school on a predetermined route, using cross walks. Establish a route and make sure they know to stick to that route.

State law requires vehicles to stop when meeting or overtaking schools buses stopped with red flashing lights.


