RED BANK POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Department is excited to announce that we now have social workers as part of our department.

The Borough has contracted for one year with P.U.L.S.S.E (Proactive Union of Law Enforcement and Social Service Experts) to provide social workers for our agency on a part-time basis. The key role of these professionals will be to follow-up with residents and others who need assistance connecting with services such as mental health counseling, addiction services, or housing assistance. These follow-ups will be based on referrals from our police officers. In many instances, we find that our officers respond to the same residences or interact with the same people repeatedly. Oftentimes, this is due to the fact that these individuals need assistance that goes beyond the role and expertise

of our officers and the assistance we can provide is often temporary.

There is a long standing history of police departments working with social workers to ensure the safety of communities and the people that live and work there. The intervention of social services has become a necessary part in maintaining the welfare of a community by monitoring community health and safety issues.

The goal of this program is to reduce those police interactions and provide our residents who are in need with the assistance they require.

A special thank you to Sayreville PD, who has a similar and successful program in place and generously provided their assistance in getting this program started in Red Bank.



The Borough of Red Bank offered a free training session by Doug Haviland, a certified instructor, to staff and elected officials. The class covered adult and infant/child CPR, obstructed airway, the Heimlich Maneuver, use of a barrier device, and AED (Automated External Defibrillator), hands-on training. This class was open to all borough employees and officials looking for a basic certified course. Thank you Doug!

Nourish your body and soul every Friday at 11am with Friday Dance Fitness with Erkya at the Red Bank Public Library.




