

REMINDER - Fall Leaf Collection begins in November and runs through December.

Ord No. §590-17.C: Leaves may be placed at the curb for collection, either loose or in biodegradable bags, provided that the piles do not constitute a traffic or safety hazard. Properties in areas designated by the Department of Public Utilities as having potential for traffic or safety hazards shall be permitted to bag the leaves for collection in biodegradable bags.

- West of Broad Street Collection is the second Thursday of the month.**

East of Broad Street Collection is on the third Thursday of the month.

The final brush collection of the season will take place in October as we transition to leaf collection. We encourage residents to take advantage of this service by placing their brush at the curb on the assigned collection date before the end of October.

After the brush collection concludes in October, our team will begin leaf collection from November through December. Leaf collection will continue through the fall, and we will do our best to ensure timely service.

Please remember the following guidelines when preparing your brush and leaves for collection.

- Do not block fire hydrants:** Keep brush clear of fire hydrants to ensure they are accessible in an emergency.
- Avoid storm drains:** Please do not place brush over storm drains to prevent any blockages or flooding.
- Avoid painted yellow areas:** Brush should not be placed in areas painted yellow, as this could obstruct visibility or create safety hazards.

These devices are your first line of defense, providing early warnings that can save lives.

This Fire Prevention Week, we encourage all Red Bank residents to take the time to inspect and maintain your smoke alarms. It's a small task that can have life-saving implications.
