Clerk Hanlon Reminds Monmouth County Vote-by-Mail Voters of Enhanced BallotTrax System

Only ballot-tracking system statewide that provides voter notifications

FREEHOLD, NJ – Monmouth County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon is reminding Monmouth County voters who choose to vote by mail in the 2025 General Election to sign up for BallotTrax, the County's enhanced ballot-tracking notification system. Launched in Monmouth County in 2020 by Clerk Hanlon and the Monmouth County Board of Elections, BallotTrax sends notifications to voters regarding the status of their mail-in ballots.

Voters who sign up for Monmouth County BallotTrax will receive alerts when their ballot has been received by the County Board of Elections and again after the ballot has been counted.

Users of this free service can opt to

enable notifications by text message, phone or email. Monmouth County vote-by-mail voters may sign up to receive BallotTrax notifications at

“Signing up for BallotTrax is easy and provides peace of mind for mail-in ballot voters,” said Clerk Hanlon. “I am pleased to provide this free service—the only enhanced notification system in the state—for Monmouth County residents who vote by mail.”

BallotTrax alerts voters of the status of their ballots rather than requiring voters to continually log into the system for updates. Voters can also check the status of their ballots via the [state’s ballot tracking system](#), which does not provide notifications.

About the Clerk of Elections / Monmouth County Clerk

The Monmouth County Clerk serves as the Clerk of Elections, one of three independent entities overseeing the elections process in Monmouth County in conjunction with the Superintendent of Elections and Board of Elections. The Clerk of Elections processes vote-by-mail ballot applications, prepares ballots, verifies candidate petitions and certifies elections results. Voter registration, voting records and voting machines fall under the purview of the Superintendent of Elections, while the Board of Elections is responsible for counting ballots, overseeing poll workers and maintaining polling locations.

The [Office of the Monmouth County Clerk](#) is comprised of five divisions handling elections, property recordings, archives, passports and records management. The County Clerk’s Office also provides resident, veteran and Gold Star Family identification cards to eligible county residents, administers oaths to notaries and public officials and performs wedding ceremonies. The Monmouth County Clerk is a constitutional and administrative officer elected to a five-year term by the voters of Monmouth County. Christine Giordano Hanlon, Esq. was elected Monmouth County Clerk in November 2015 and was re-elected to a second term in November 2020.
