WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidated Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. (the "Act") authorizes local government units to enter into agreements with each other to provide or receive any service which the parties to an agreement are empowered to render or contact for within their own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Shrewsbury (the "Township") and the Borough of Red Bank (the "Borough") both require the provision of emergency medical services to serve and protect their citizens during emergencies and other incidents; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has an existing contract for emergency medical services with a third-party service provider, Community Health Group, which has likewise agreed to expand its service area to encompass the Township in return for compensation paid by the Township to the Borough toward the costs of the third-party contract; and

WHEREAS, the Township and Borough have negotiated a Shared Services Agreement whereby the Borough will provide emergency medical services to the Township, which Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit A;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor & Council of the Borough of Red Bank as follows:

1. That the Borough is hereby authorized to enter into the Shared Services Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A with the Township, pursuant to the "Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act", N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq., to provide the emergency medical services referenced therein.
2. That the Mayor is authorized to execute and the Municipal Clerk to attest to the Agreement.
3. That a certified copy of this resolution shall be provided to the Borough Manager, the Township of Shrewsbury, and Community Health Group.

**SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK
AND THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL
SERVICES**

THIS AGREEMENT made this 14th day of November, 2025, by and

between:

THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK (hereinafter referred to as the
Borough); and

THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY (hereinafter referred to as the
"Township",

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, it is the consensus of the Borough and the Township that the Township is in need of a "Emergency Medical Services" in Shrewsbury Township, and the Borough has entered into a Professional Service Contract with the Community Health Group d/b/a JFK University Medical Center for emergency medical ambulance services within the Borough from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. authorizes joint activities among municipalities and was enacted with the intent to facilitate and promote Shared Service Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and the Township wish to enter into a Shared Service Agreement for emergency medical services provided by the Borough through its contractor aforesaid to the Township as a Shared Service Agreement for 2026 at an annual fee of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) per year; or a monthly rate of \$666.67 per month beginning January 1, 2026 and terminating December 31, 2026.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **Nature and Extent of Services:** The Borough hereby agrees through its contract with the Community Health Group d/b/a JFK University Medical Center (hereinafter referred to as "JFK EMS") to provide emergency medical services to the Township on a seven day a week, 24 hour per day basis.
2. **Standards and Allocation of Responsibility:** The Borough and personnel utilized for JFK EMS in the Township shall perform their duties with regard to any emergency medical calls in the Township with the standards, level, quality and scope of performance required by JFK EMS services and the laws of the State of New Jersey, and shall assign and allocate total responsibility for handling calls from the Borough based on dispatcher services available in Monmouth County.
3. **Consideration:** In consideration for the services to be rendered by the Borough on behalf of the Township, the Township shall pay an annual fee of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) per year; or \$2000.00 per quarter in 2026.
4. **Duration of the Contract:** The term of this contract shall commence on January 1, 2026 and terminate on December 31, 2026.
5. **Method of Payment:** The Township hereby promises to pay the Borough its consideration in four (4) equal installments on a quarterly basis of each year of this contract.
6. **Agency Relationship:** It is hereby acknowledged that the Borough and all personnel utilized by JFK EMS are performing services as a general agent for the Township and shall have all the powers of performance reasonable,


necessary and convenient to carry out the duties, obligations and responsibilities under the agreement and allowable by law.

7. **Arbitration:** Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be settled pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey by arbitration in accordance with the rules, then existing, of the American Arbitration Association or similar arbitrator and judgment upon an award rendered pursuant to such arbitration may be entered in any court in the State of New Jersey having jurisdiction thereof. In the event of a conflict between the Rules of the American Arbitration Association or any other chosen arbitrator and any Statute of the State of New Jersey, the parties agree to be bound by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

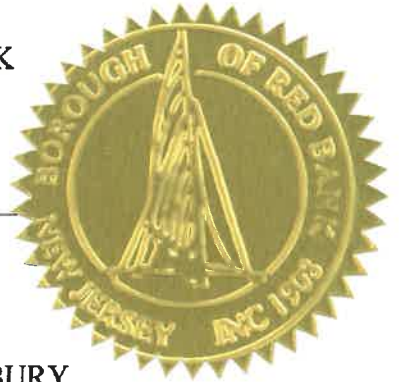

**SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK AND
THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY FOR
MUNICIPAL CLERK SERVICES**

THIS AGREEMENT made this 1st day of January, 2026 by and between:

THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK and

THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, as a result of prior resignation of the Shrewsbury Township Clerk and the undertaking of the position by an Acting Municipal Clerk seeking her Certification, and due to the need for Municipal Clerk, there is a need for services for a period of time prior to Certification of the Acting Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. authorizes joint activities among municipalities and was enacted with the intent to facilitate and promote Shared Service Agreements; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that due to the State's requirement of a Municipal Clerk obtaining her State Certification, it would be the most economical and efficient option to establish a Shared Service Agreement with a municipality with regard to the use of Municipal Clerk services for two (2) to seven (7) hours per week, as needed in discretion of Clerk; while a Deputy Clerk within Shrewsbury Township performs any services statutorily allowed for those hours that the Municipal Clerk is not present.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **Nature and Extent of Services:** The Borough of Red Bank shall provide services of its Clerk, Mary Moss, who is certified as a Municipal Clerk by the State of New Jersey, to serve as the part-time Municipal Clerk of Shrewsbury Township, and to serve during regular business hours (two (2) to seven (7) hours per week, as needed in her discretion), while allowing the Deputy Clerk of Shrewsbury Township to work all remaining hours of the workweek, while the Municipal Clerk of the Borough of Red Bank assumes

all responsibilities of the Municipal Clerk for Shrewsbury Township; subject to the assistance of the Deputy Clerk of Shrewsbury Township.

2. **Standards and Allocation of Responsibility:** The Borough of Red Bank's personnel, subject to this Agreement, shall perform her duties with regard to Municipal Clerk in accordance with the standards, level and quality and scope of performance required of such services of a Municipal Clerk licensed and certified in the State of New Jersey, and shall be assigned and allocated total responsibility for such services for Shrewsbury Township during normal hours of operation in Shrewsbury Township for two (2) to seven (7) hours per week, as needed in the Clerk's discretion, with the remaining hours and the day-to-day operations handled by the Deputy Clerk of Shrewsbury Township..

3. **Consideration:** In consideration for the services to be rendered by the Borough of Red Bank on behalf of the Shrewsbury Township, Shrewsbury Township shall pay the Borough of Red Bank \$1,000.00 per month, or \$6,000.00 for six-month duration of the contract, for services from beginning January 1, 2026 through June 30, 2026. Payment shall be apportioned per month and paid on a monthly basis. This Agreement shall not prevent Mary Moss from performing other functions assigned and agreed upon between the parties in Shrewsbury Township, such as monitoring elections or any other such agreed upon service.

4. **Duration of the Contract:** The term of this Agreement shall commence January 1, 2026 with approval by Resolution, and shall terminate on June 30, 2026. However, either party, upon thirty (30) days' written notice, may terminate this Agreement prior to June 30, 2026 by written intent to terminate the Agreement.

5. **Method of Payment:** The Township of Shrewsbury shall promise to pay the Borough of Red Bank the consideration as stated above on a monthly basis in the amount apportioned by the months of service based on \$6,000.00 if served for the entire term of January 1, 2026 through June 30, 2026; or \$1,000.00 per month if terminated short of the six-month period.


6. **Agency Relationship:** It is hereby acknowledged that the Township of Shrewsbury and all personnel of the Borough of Red Bank who are subject to this Agreement are performing services under this

Agreement as general agents for the Township of Shrewsbury and shall have all the powers of performance reasonably necessary and convenient to carry out the duties, obligations and responsibilities under the agreement and allowable by law.

7. **Enactment Procedures:** The Borough of Red Bank and the Township of Shrewsbury hereby acknowledge that prior to the execution of this Agreement, the respective municipal bodies shall authorize the same through and by the procedures and standards for adoption of ordinances and/or resolutions set forth more fully under the Uniform Shared Service and Consolidation Act N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1.

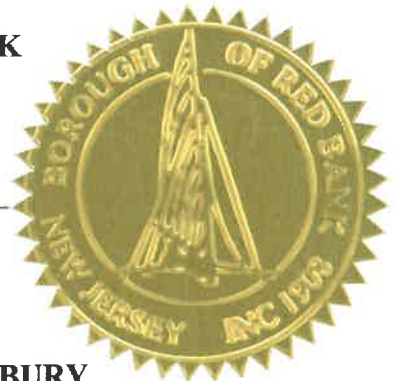

**SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK AND THE
TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY FOR THE
SHARED USE OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT**

THIS AGREEMENT made this 14th day of November 2025 by and between:

THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK (hereinafter referred to as the Borough); and

THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY (hereinafter referred to as the "Township"),

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, it is the consensus of the Borough and the Township that the Township is in need of a "Shared Facility" for the operation of the Shrewsbury Township Municipal Court and that the Borough of Red Bank Municipal Court is able to provide suitable court facilities for such use; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. authorizes joint activities among municipalities and was enacted with the intent to facilitate and promote shared service agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and the Township believe that a sharing of court facilities, personnel and services shall provide for a more efficient and economic use of such facilities, personnel and services and will be beneficial to both the Borough and the Township and the tax payers of both municipalities.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **Nature and Extent of Services:** The Borough shall be appointed as the court facility to be used by the Township. The Township Municipal Court cases will be heard by the Borough Municipal Court, and the Township shall appoint its Municipal Court Judge, Prosecutor and Public Defender. All remaining court staff for the Township Municipal Court will be provided by the Borough, and will consist of a Court Administrator and any Deputy Court Administrator(s), Violations Clerk(s) and/or additional individuals that are necessary to service the Municipal Court.

2. **Standards and Allocation of Responsibility:** The Borough's Municipal Court and the Municipal Court personnel subject to this agreement shall perform their duties with regards to the cases involving Shrewsbury Township in accordance with the standards, level, quality and scope of performance required by the Borough and the laws of the State of New Jersey and shall be assigned and allocated total responsibility for handling all cases that would arise normally in the Township Municipal Court.

3. **Consideration:** In consideration for the services to be rendered by the Borough on behalf of the Township, the Township shall pay an annual fee of \$7,000.00 per year for the term of this Agreement, in return for which the Borough shall provide the court facilities and support personnel who normally service the Municipal Court.

4. **Duration of the Contract:** The term of this contract shall commence on January 1, 2026 and terminate on December 31, 2029.

5. **Method of Payment:** The Township hereby promises to pay the Borough its consideration of \$7,000.00 per year in two (2) equal installments due April 1st and October 1st of each year of this contract. The Borough promises to return all collected fines for violations incurred within the Township of Shrewsbury as they are collected on a monthly basis.

6. **Fines and Violations:** The Township shall continue to be entitled to receive and shall receive 100% of fines collected for violations that occur within the Township of Shrewsbury without a cap or sharing between the municipalities.

7. **Agency Relationship:** It is hereby acknowledged that the Municipal Court of the Borough and all personnel within the Municipal Court subject to this agreement are performing services under this agreement as a general agent for the Township and shall have all the powers of performance reasonably necessary and convenient to carry out the duties, obligations and responsibilities under the agreement and allowable by law.


8. **Enactment Procedures:** The Borough and the Township hereby acknowledge that prior to the execution of this agreement, the respective municipal bodies shall authorize the same

through and by the procedures and standards for adoption of ordinances and/or resolutions set forth more fully under the Uniform Shared Service and Consolidation Act N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1. In addition should approval of this agreement be necessary by the Administrator of Courts then final implementation shall be subject to said approval.

9. **Arbitration:** Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be settled pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey by arbitration in accordance with the rules, then existing, of the American Arbitration Association or similar arbitrator and judgment upon an award rendered pursuant to such arbitration may be entered in any court in the State of New Jersey having jurisdiction thereof. In the event of a conflict between the Rules of the American Arbitration Association or any other chosen arbitrator and any Statute of the State of New Jersey, the parties agree to be bound by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

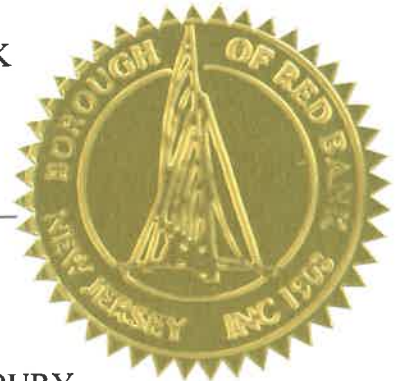



RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE COMBINATION OF CERTAIN ISSUES OF NOT EXCEEDING \$8,360,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2025, CONSISTING OF \$6,075,000 GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2025 AND \$2,285,000 WATER AND SEWER UTILITY BONDS, SERIES 2025, OF THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DETERMINING THE FORM AND OTHER DETAILS OF SUCH BONDS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY'S 2025 POOLED GOVERNMENTAL LOAN PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Borough of Red Bank (the "Borough"), in the County of Monmouth, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Borough to finance the costs of various general capital improvements (the "General Improvements Projects") and water and sewer capital improvements (the "Water and Sewer Improvements Projects" and together with the General Improvements Projects, the "Projects") throughout the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has duly adopted various bond ordinances (the "Ordinances") to appropriate moneys and authorize the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes to undertake the Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined to finance the Projects with the proceeds of a loan (the "Loan") to be made to the Borough by the Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "MCIA") from proceeds generated by the MCIA in connection with the Series 2025 Pooled Governmental Loan Program currently scheduled to close on or about December 24, 2025 (the "2025 MCIA Bond Program"); and

WHEREAS, in order for the Borough to receive the Loan from the MCIA, it is necessary to combine the bonds authorized under said Ordinances, by fund, into one issue of bonds per fund, namely (i) a general improvement bond series in the principal amount of not to exceed \$6,075,000, and (ii) a water and sewer utility bond series in the principal amount of not to exceed \$2,285,000, aggregating said amount, and to memorialize the applicable obligations of the general capital improvement fund and the water and sewer utility fund of the Borough, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"); and

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loan, the MCIA also requires the Borough to authorize, execute, attest and deliver to the MCIA, the Borough's not to exceed \$8,360,000 General Obligation Bonds, Series 2025, consisting of \$6,075,000 General Improvement Bonds, Series 2025 (the "General Improvement Bonds"), and \$2,285,000 Water and Sewer Utility Bonds, Series 2025 (the "Water and Sewer Utility Bonds", and together with the General Improvement Bonds, the "Bonds"), in accordance with the provisions hereof and pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law; and

WHEREAS, section 27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Bonds to the MCIA without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in a Bond Purchase Agreement to be entered into by and between the Borough and the MCIA to be dated as of the date of the sale of such Bonds (as hereinafter defined).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF RED BANK, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-26(f), the bonds of the Borough, authorized pursuant to the general improvement bond ordinances (the "General Improvement Ordinances") of the Borough heretofore adopted and described in Section 2 hereof, shall be combined into a single issue of General Improvement Bonds, Series 2025, in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$6,075,000 and shall memorialize the obligations of the general capital improvement fund of the Borough.

SECTION 2. The principal amount of bonds authorized by each General Improvement Ordinance to be combined into a single issue of bonds as provided above, and the General Improvement Ordinances authorizing the General Improvement Bonds described by reference to the ordinance number, description and date of final adoption, amount of issue and average period of usefulness determined in each of the General Improvement Ordinances, are respectively as follows:

SECTION 3. The following matters are hereby determined with respect to the combined issue of General Improvement Bonds:

(a) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of General Improvement Bonds presently authorized to be issued pursuant to each of the General Improvement Ordinances and the respective periods or average periods of usefulness therein determined, is not more than 11.52 years.

(b) The General Improvement Bonds of the combined issue shall be designated "General Improvement Bonds, Series 2025", and shall mature within the average period of usefulness determined in Section 3(a) above.

(c) The General Improvement Bonds of the combined issue shall be sold and issued in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law that are applicable to the sale and issuance of bonds to an authority or political subdivision of a county under Section 27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) None of the General Improvement Bonds described in Section 2 hereof have been sold or issued heretofore, and the several General Improvement Ordinances described in Section 2 have not been rescinded heretofore and now remain in full force and effect as authorizations for the respective amounts of bonds set opposite the descriptions of the General Improvement Ordinances set forth in Section 2 hereof.

(b) The several purposes or improvements authorized by the respective General Improvement Ordinances described in Section 2 hereof are purposes for which bonds may be issued lawfully pursuant to the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 5. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-26(f), the bonds of the Borough, authorized pursuant to the water and sewer utility bond ordinances (the "Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances") of the Borough heretofore adopted and described in Section 6 hereof, shall be combined into a single issue of Water and Sewer Utility Bonds, Series 2025, in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$2,285,000, and shall memorialize the obligations of the water and sewer utility fund of the Borough.

SECTION 6. The principal amount of bonds authorized by each Water and Sewer Utility Ordinance to be combined into a single issue of bonds as provided above, and

the Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances authorizing the Water and Sewer Utility Bonds described by reference to the ordinance number, description and date of final adoption, amount of issue and average period of usefulness determined in each of the Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances, are respectively as follows:

SECTION 7. The following matters are hereby determined with respect to the combined issue of Water and Sewer Utility Bonds:

(a) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of Water and Sewer Utility Bonds presently authorized to be issued pursuant to each of the Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances and the respective periods or average periods of usefulness therein determined, is not more than 12.12 years.

(b) The Water and Sewer Utility Bonds of the combined issue shall be designated "Water and Sewer Utility Bonds, Series 2025", and shall mature within the average period of usefulness determined in Section 7(a) above.

(c) The Water and Sewer Utility Bonds of the combined issue shall be sold and issued in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law that are applicable to the sale and issuance of bonds to an authority or political subdivision of a county under Section 27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 8. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) None of the Water and Sewer Utility Bonds described in Section 6 hereof have been sold or issued heretofore, and the several Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances described in Section 6 have not been rescinded heretofore and now remain in full force and effect as authorizations for the respective amounts of bonds set opposite the descriptions of the Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances set forth in Section 6 hereof.

(b) The several purposes or improvements authorized by the respective Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances described in Section 6 hereof are purposes for which bonds may be issued lawfully pursuant to the Local Bond Law and such improvements or

purposes, if applicable and permitted by law, are deductible from gross debt in any annual or supplemental debt statement of the Borough, as the Water and Sewer Utility Fund is self-liquidating.

SECTION 9. The General Improvement Bonds and the Water and Sewer Utility Bonds are sometimes collectively referred to herein as the "Bonds". The General Improvement Ordinances and the Water and Sewer Utility Ordinances are sometimes collectively referred to herein as the "Ordinances".

SECTION 10. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) and pursuant to the Ordinances, the Borough hereby authorizes the sale and award of, and hereby sells and awards, the Borough's Bonds to the MCIA in accordance with the provisions hereof and in accordance with the terms of a Bond Purchase Agreement to be executed by and between the Borough and the MCIA (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"). The Mayor of the Borough (the "Mayor") and Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer") are each hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Borough, in consultation with Bond Counsel (as hereinafter defined), to negotiate and approve the terms of such Bond Purchase Agreement, to be dated the date of sale of the Bonds, and to execute and deliver said Bond Purchase Agreement to the MCIA. The Bonds have been referred to and described in the Ordinances finally adopted at duly called and held meetings of the Borough Council and published as required by law, and such Ordinances are combined for purposes of sale pursuant to this resolution, all pursuant to terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

SECTION 11. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2), the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the MCIA and the terms and conditions hereof and as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the following items with respect to the Bonds, except those terms and conditions which are set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement:

- (a) The aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued, provided that the total amount of Bonds issued shall not exceed the aggregate principal amount of \$8,360,000, issued in two series aggregating said amount;
- (b) The maturity and principal installments of the Bonds, which maturity shall not exceed 11.52 years for the General Improvement Bonds and 12.12 years for the Water and Sewer Utility Bonds, respectively;
- (c) The date of the Bonds of each series;
- (d) The interest rates of the Bonds of each series;
- (e) The purchase price of the Bonds of each series; and

- (f) The terms and conditions under which the Bonds of each series shall be subject to redemption, as applicable, prior to their stated maturities.

SECTION 12. Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Bonds by the parties authorized under Section 13(c) hereof.

SECTION 13. The Borough Council hereby determine that certain terms of the Bonds shall be as follows:

- (a) The Bonds of each series shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered (i) GI-1 for the General Improvement Bonds, and (ii) WSU-1 for the Water and Sewer Utility Bonds (or such other designation as determined by Bond Counsel);
- (b) The Bonds of each series shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owners thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
- (c) The Bonds of each series shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, imprinted or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Clerk of the Borough (the "Borough Clerk").

SECTION 14. The Bonds of each series shall be in the form set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto with such additions, deletions and omissions as may be necessary for the Borough to comply with the requirements of the 2025 MCIA Bond Program, upon the advice of Bond Counsel.

SECTION 15. The law firm of Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Woodbridge, New Jersey, Bond Counsel to the Borough ("Bond Counsel"), NW Financial Group, LLC, Municipal Advisor to the MCIA (the "Municipal Advisor"), the Borough Engineer, the Borough Attorney and the Borough Auditor are each hereby authorized and directed to perform all actions necessary to consummate the issuance of the Bonds and the respective Projects for which each series of the Bonds are issued, including, but not limited to, drafting and arranging for the printing and execution of the Bonds and all applicable documentation necessary to memorialize and consummate the issuance of the Bonds and the undertaking of the Projects, and preparing all necessary financial information, all engineering and design work, preparation of plans and specifications and conducting all necessary studies, searches and analysis in connection with the issuance of the Bonds and the undertaking of the Projects. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer, the Borough Clerk, the Borough Attorney and any other Borough representative (including Bond Counsel, the Municipal Advisor or the Borough Auditor) are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any certificates, documents, instruments or agreements necessary or desirable in

connection with the submission of financial and other information to the MCIA related thereto.

SECTION 16. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer, the Borough Clerk and any other Borough representative are each hereby authorized and directed to (i) execute any certificates, documents, instruments or agreements necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Bonds, including the Bond Purchase Agreement, or the undertaking of the Projects, and each are hereby further authorized and directed to deliver same to the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "County") and/or the MCIA, as applicable, upon delivery of the Bonds and the applicable receipts of payment therefor, or in accordance with the 2025 MCIA Bond Program, and (ii) perform such other actions as they deem necessary, desirable or convenient, in consultation with Bond Counsel and/or the Municipal Advisor, in relation to the execution and delivery of the Bonds and any certificates, documents, instruments or agreements necessary or desirable in connection therewith.

SECTION 17. The Mayor and Chief Financial Officer are each hereby authorized and directed, without further authorization, to enter into and execute a continuing disclosure agreement or such other agreement as may be required by the MCIA for purposes of complying with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, as amended and interpreted from time to time, in a form satisfactory to Bond Counsel.

SECTION 18. The Borough hereby covenants that it will comply with any conditions subsequent imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, in order to preserve the exemption from taxation of interest on the Bonds issued as tax-exempt obligations, including the requirement to rebate all net investment earnings on gross proceeds above the yield on the Bonds, if necessary.

SECTION 19. Upon the adoption hereof, the Borough Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution: (a) via electronic email, to (i) John D. Johnson, Esq., Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., 90 Woodbridge Center Drive, Woodbridge, New Jersey 07095.

SECTION 20. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
