

Trees suitable for undersized lots and smaller spaces

Acer griseum, paperbark maple
Acer palmatum, Japanese laceleaf maple, multiple varieties
Aesculus pavia, Red buckeye *
Amelanchier canadensis, Shadblow serviceberry *
Cercis canadensis, Eastern Redbud *
Cornus alternifolia, pagoda dogwood *
Cornus florida, American dogwood *
Cornus kousa, Japanese dogwood
Halesia Carolina, Carolina silverbells *
Magnolia soulangiana, saucer magnolia
Magnolia stellata, star magnolia
Magnolia virginiana, sweetbay magnolia *
Oxydendrum arboreum, sourwood *
Prunus okame, okame cherry
Prunus subhirtella 'Pendulata' weeping cherry
Styrax Japonica, Japanese snowbell
Syringa reticulata, Japanese tree lilac
Viburnum, multiple species. Shrubs that mature to tree like proportions.

Native species are denoted with asterisks. Natives are often preferred due to their adaptation to New Jersey climate, disease resistance, and benefits to native butterflies and song birds. When planting small trees near the foundation of your home, it is wise to place at least 10' from the house. Even smaller trees need space as they grow. This list should serve as a guide and is no means a definitive list.
