**A RESOLUTION COMMENDING KATHLEEN BOYLAN ON BEING NAMED
TEACHER OF THE YEAR FOR THE RED BANK CHARTER SCHOOL**

Councilwoman Horgan offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Kathleen Boylan was born in Red Bank and attended the Eatontown School District from Kindergarten through Eighth Grade and then went on to Monmouth Regional High School; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Boylan attended The College of New Jersey where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education with a specialization in Mathematics; and

WHEREAS, upon graduation, Ms. Boylan began her career in the Little Silver School District where she taught 7th grade Mathematics until she became pregnant with twins; and

WHEREAS, in the fall of 2009, she began substitute teaching in Atlantic Highlands in a position teaching 5th and 6th grade math and then served as a part-time basic skills teacher for the majority of the 2010-2011 school year; and

WHEREAS, she was hired by the Red Bank Charter School in July 2011 where she has been teaching 6th through 8th grade math for three years; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Boylan has said she enjoys relating math concepts to real life situations and creating songs to help the students remember tricky concepts through music; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her time in the classroom, she serves as the 8th grade homeroom teacher/advisor, has led both the Just Dance Club and Running Club and has been responsible for fundraising for multiple 8th grade trips, organizing the 8th Grade Internship Program, and organizing the 8th grade service learning project with this year's project benefiting 180 Turning Lives Around in Hazlet; and

WHEREAS, as a result of her dedication to the children of Red Bank, Ms. Boylan has been named by the Red Bank Charter School as its Teacher of the Year for 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Red Bank to commend and congratulate Kathleen Boylan on the accomplishment of being named 2014 Teacher of the Year and, on behalf of the citizens of Red Bank, thank her for her dedication to the Borough's children and express to her the warmest and best wishes for continuing health and happiness.
