**A RESOLUTION HONORING & CONGRATULATING THE NAACP
IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR 100TH ANNIVERSARY**

Mr. DuPont offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the strength and success of the State of New Jersey, the vitality of our communities, and the effectiveness of our American society depend, in great measure, upon citizens and organizations, exemplified by the members and leaders of the NAACP, who unite voluntarily, act together, and provide their unique talents to further a cause, to perform a necessary service, to support one another and their communities, or to relieve others from unavoidable hardship;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Red Bank that they honor and congratulate the NAACP in recognition of its 100th Anniversary, salute its many years of service to this Borough, State and nation, and extend sincere best wishes for its continued vigor and success.
